Paul is Senior Pastor of Swindon Evangelical Church. He is the co-author of *Travel Through Israel* and the author of *Travel With William Cowper*. Paul has also been leading tours of Israel since 1994 and serves on the board of Day One.

Day 1 - Thursday 11th Oct

Heathrow to Tel Aviv.

Dinner & overnight in Jerusalem's Olive Tree Hotel.

Day 2 - Friday 12th Oct

Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel – and hear about the significance and location of the Temple. Coming out onto the Via Dolorosa, the coach picks us up below the Lion Gate (St. Stephen's Gate).

Drive to the top of the Mount of Olives.

Understand the significance of burial in a Jewish context.

Dominus Flevit – Jesus weeping over Jerusalem. Garden of Gethsemane.

Kidron Valley.

St Peter in Gallicantu – Peter's denial of Jesus.

Go to Abraham's Ridge overlooking the city.

Garden Tomb & Communion. Then a brief time to rest and/or visit the shop.

Free evening to relax or walk through Old City to the Western Wall.

Overnight in Jerusalem's Olive Tree Hotel.

(including a Shabbat demonstration).

Day 3 - Saturday 13th Oct

Go up onto the Temple Mount area and gain an understanding of the Biblical history of Moriah, Araunah's threshing floor etc.

Walking tour of the Old City.

Pools of Bethesda – understanding John 5.

The Roman Pavement / Lithostratos, Herod's Cistern etc.

Ecce Homo, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, discussion re: the site of Calvary.

The Jewish Quarter, Nehemiah's broad wall, the Burnt House – understanding 1st Century life in Jerusalem.

Walk through the Dung Gate down to the City of David archeological centre and see the 3D presentation of the history of the City of David. Make our way down and down, noting the importance of recent archeological discoveries, and come to Warren's Shaft and the entrance to Hezekiah's tunnel.

Walk through Hezekiah's Tunnel (appropriately prepared with torches and water shoes) to the Pool of Siloam – note the area of the Pool of Siloam near the Herodian Street. (A dry Caananite tunnel for those not so adventurous!). Overnight in Jerusalem's Olive Tree Hotel.

Day 4 - Sunday 14th Oct

Morning Service at the Hotel.

Rest of the morning free.

Afternoon – optional walks (eg to Christ Church, Jaffa Gate).

Evening service.

Overnight in Jerusalem's Olive Tree Hotel.

Day 5 - Monday 15th Oct

Drive south through the Judean Hills past the Inn Of The Good Samaritan.

Masada – the Jewish last stand against the Romans & AD 70.

Qumran – understand the biblical significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls.

Visit En Gedi National Park to see the waterfalls.
The Dead Sea - an opportunity to float in the world's lowest sea, 423m below sea level.
Overnight in Jerusalem's Olive Tree Hotel.

Day 6 - Tuesday 16th Oct

Visit Bethlehem.
Drive up through the Jordan Valley.
Visit Gideon's Spring at the foot of Mount Gilboa.
Visit Beth Shean where the Philistines hung the bodies of King Saul and his sons on the city walls.
Arrive at Kibbutz Ma'agan, Galilee.

Day 7 - Wednesday 17th Oct

Sail on the Sea of Galilee – note the geography of the lake – overview of the northern towns & Jesus' ministry within the 'gospel triangle' of Capernaum-Korazin-Bethsaida, the significance of the Horns of Hattin etc.
Nof Ginossar – the Galilee Boat.
Capernaum – significance of the archaeological remains there.
Korazin – note the importance of the Mikveh etc.
Mount of Beatitudes – the Sermon on the Mount.
St Peter's Primacy / Tabgha – the restoration of Peter by Jesus.
Overnight at Kibbutz Ma'agan, Galilee.

Day 8 - Thursday 18th Oct

Tel Dan Nature Reserve – walk to Tel Dan through the beautiful Dan National Park.
See Mount Hermon in the distance. Note the structure and significance of the 'Gate' of the city in those days, also background to the idolatry at Dan in Biblical history – Jezebel, Jeroboam II etc.
Caesarea Philippi (Banyas) - some background in Greek mythology, significance of "Gates of Hell" and Peter's confession of Jesus in this context.
Return via the Golan Heights.
Visit Kursi - recalling Jesus healing the demon-possessed man.
Optional Evening visit to the 'Galilee Experience' multimedia presentation, overviewing the Biblical history of the Galilee.
Overnight at Kibbutz Ma'agan, Galilee.

Day 9 - Friday 19th Oct

Drive to Nazareth, passing through Cana and noting the significance of Jewish weddings and the importance in Christ's ministry. Visit the Biblical village and the Synagogue Church.
Drive to Megiddo – the plain of Armageddon, passing Mount Tabor, the traditional site of Jesus' transfiguration.
Mount Carmel range & Muhraqah – Elijah and the significance of 1 Kings 18. See one of the finest views across the Jezreel plains.
Visit Caesarea by the sea, the place of Paul's departure, and see the ancient Roman amphitheatre and ancient aqueduct.
Overnight at the Gilgal Hotel, Tel Aviv.

Day 10 - Sat 20th Oct

Return flight Tel Aviv – Heathrow.

Passports, Visas and Vaccinations

Further information will be sent to you regarding any action that may be required approximately 12 weeks before departure.

A final invoice will also be sent at this time and the balance for the tour must be paid at least 10 weeks before departure.

Travel Information

Full travel information, including details of meeting points, flight times, accommodation and travel information, will be sent to you approximately 2 weeks before departure. Normally, tickets are not issued but are handed to you at the airport or departure point by our representative who will be there to ensure that you depart without a hitch and to deal with any last minute difficulties.

Travel Insurance

It is compulsory to have travel insurance for your booking. Holiday Extras have a range of policies available at very competitive prices.

Gratuities

Our normal procedure is to deal with tips on a group basis and these are included in the price. The tour leader will distribute them to the guide, driver and hotels on your behalf. Individual tipping is not recommended unless the circumstances are exceptional.

Room Check In and Check Out Times

The standard international practice is to let rooms from midday to midday. However times do vary. Check-in times are usually between 2pm and 3pm, check-out times between 11am and 12 noon on the day of departure. Therefore, if you check-in immediately after a night flight this would normally count as one night's accommodation. Similarly if your return flight is at night you will normally be required to vacate your room at 12 noon prior to leaving for the airport. Day rooms are subject to availability/cost and should be arranged locally with the accommodation management.
